Report: "Innovation of Traditional Arts and Crafts" (presented by SIED)

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"Innovation of traditional arts and crafts" was held under the auspices of A Study Group of Management in Kyoto (ASGMK) and SIED in Imadegawa campus on Saturday, November 11th. 12 ASGMK members and 17 students including 6 international students joined the event.
